### Housing

For the majority of YMCA Camp Carson staff, working at Camp also means living at Camp for the summer. Housing, as outlined in the position descriptions throughout this document, is provided at no charge to staff living at camp.



### Meals & Dietary Needs

Meals are provided to all staff while they are working at camp. YMCA Camp Carson kitchen staff work hard to accommodate a wide range of dietary restrictions, such as gluten-free, vegetarian, and vegan. Peanuts are not served or cooked in any camp meals. Please let us know your restriction so that we can partner in creating menus to ensure you are fueled for the summer. Staff are able to keep personal food in the Staff Wellness Center.



### **Staff Wellness Center**

YMCA Camp Carson offers a state of the art Staff Wellness Building for all staff. It includes:

- small gym with free weights, mats, and basic machines.
- living area with sofas and TV.
- basic kitchen with refrigerator, oven/stove, microwave, coffee maker, and soda machine.
- full laundry facility with washers and dryers for personal use at no cost.
- technology center with computer and printer



### Time Off

During time off, staff are welcome to depart Camp and are expected to honor the Social Contract for the summer.



### Princeton, IN

Princeton is Camp Carson's nearest community, a 10-15 minute drive from Camp. Princeton is a robust rural community with many restaurants, grocery stores, and a hospital.



### Evansville, IN

Evansville is home of the YMCA of Southwestern Indiana. A 40-50 minute drive from Camp, it offers many entertainment and dining options. We may provide staff outings to Evansville over the summer, and many staff go into Evansville on weekends.

It is a very real job and the American Camp Association has identified many of the benefits camp staff receive: leadership, 21st century skills, professional development, training, and more! The following are some benefits specific to YMCA Camp Carson:

### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Every role at camp will challenge staff members to grow as professionals and leaders. Time management, interpersonal skills, communication, public speaking, innovation, project management, group leadership, conflict resolution, inclusion, work ethic, and SO MUCH MORE! Skills development at camp will benefit summer staff for the rest of their lives.

### **CAMP STORE DISCOUNTS**

For the entirety of the summer, YMCA Camp Carson staff are eligible for up to 50% off Camp apparel, souvenirs, and snacks in our Canteen.

### **CERTIFICATION PAY BOOSTS**

YMCA Camp Carson recruits staff with a wide range of skills and experiences. If you have a certification not shown on our pay scales, which you believe is an added value to your specific role, inform our team during the hiring process and they will let you know if it is eligible for a boost in your summer pay.

### **SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES**

Staff who work the full summer are eligible for two unique college scholarship awards from generous YMCA Camp Carson Alumni donors.





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# STAFF GIFTS & UNIFORMS







### **Referral Stipend**

Whether or not you will be joining us at YMCA Camp Carson this summer, you can strengthen our summer staff team by referring great leaders to join us!

Anyone who refers a new YMCA Camp Carson staff member will receive a stipend of \$100 on their last paycheck. The referred staff member must complete all hiring paperwork and complete staff training in order to receive the \$100.

Individuals who were Campers at YMCA Camp Carson in the past three years are not recognized as new staff for referrals, as there are many incredible staff leaders who have inspired them to work at camp!



### **All-Summer Completion Stipend**

Any staff member that works 8 or more camper weeks at YMCA Camp Carson during our summer season (June-August) will receive a stipend of \$360 on their last paycheck.



### **Staff Uniforms**

Staff are provided t-shirts to be worn while at camp, at a minimum on first and last days. Staff that work in our Fall season often receive cool weather gear, such as a sweatshirt. Other than YMCA Camp Carson staff gear, staff often take advantage of the staff discount at the camp store for more YMCA Camp Carson gear to wear all summer long!

### YOUR DAY

Your primary responsibility every day is supporting your campers in body, mind, and spirit while creating a community that is accepting, challenging, and empowering. You and your co-counselors will help your campers navigate independence that comes from being away from home by ensuring they are healthy and happy. One of the highlights for campers is feeling like a valuable member of their cabin community. You help foster positive relationships within your cabin by leading team-building activities and meaningful group discussions. Additionally, you are trained to lead an activity area each morning with an activity co-counselor and with the support of Activity Area Coordinators.

### YOUR LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

You will live in a state of the art cabin with up to 12 campers and 1–2 additional other Cabin Counselors.

Cabin Counselors and Junior Cabin Counselors are supported by Village Coordinators who will provide coaching and resources both in one-on-one check-ins and as a part of village-wide gatherings.

They also work with our Senior Program and Property Directors to care for our dirtbikes by cleaning and basic mechanics, and maintaining a clean and orderly dirt bike shed.

The experience you provide will give campers a sense of achievement and confidence as they overcome obstacles and learn new skills they will carry with them for life.

### YOUR DAY

Every day will follow a similar flow within the routine of on-site programs, but you will enhance your expertise by spending a majority of your time in a specific program area of camp. You will teach staff the skills of your specialty and challenge them to continue growing throughout their time at camp. Staff will then pass that knowledge onto the camperswith that same energy and challenge. When not in your specialty area, you will be supporting overall operation of camp by participating in all camp programming.

### YOUR LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

You will live in a cabin with other Coordinators and Service Corps Program members. You will serve as a mentor to their group while living with them.

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

Activities are coordinated and organized in three primary areas - Water, Land, and Creative Arts.







YOU are the LEADERs of our summer teams. Your hard work and creativity generates life-changing experiences for staff and campers.

### YOUR DAY

You will support the staff and campers with your assigned village of 2-4 camper groups. You will conduct regular one-on-one check-ins and create meaningful community building opportunities for the staff assigned to your village. Village Coordinators are responsible for planning and leading programs for the cabin, entire village, or all of camp including evening programs, large group games, and engaging cabin activities. Village Coordinators work together as a part of the leadership team to be great role models and mentors for the rest of the Camp community.



### YOUR LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

You will live in a cabin with up to 12 campers and 2 Cabin Counselors, but you have no direct camper care duties in the cabin.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Village Coordinators are supported by Program Coordinators and members of the full-time staff. Village Coordinators often have previous camp experience and are enthusiastic about sharing their experience and expertise with others.





Teens are the future of camp, our community, and our world. You are a role model for tomorrow's leaders.

### YOUR DAY

Teens can choose from three leadership-focused programs: Leader in Training (LIT), Counselor in Training (CIT), or Service Corps Program (SCP). Teen Program Coordinators create the schedule and curriculum to implement during programmatic time. Coordinators will lead team-building activities or coordinate service work. Coordinators will also support the staff and campers with your assigned teen program. The day-to-day schedule depends on whether you work with the LIT, CIT, or SCP Program.

### YOUR LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

You will live in a cabin with up to 14 teen campers and 1-2 additional other Teen Program Counselor staff.


