## **CAMP IS BACK!**

The bright smiles on campers faces, new challenges, squeals of laughter, great achievements, and instant friendships. The impact of camp stays long after the laughter subsides, carrying lessons and confidence through the year. We are so grateful to our generous donors who helped keep us going through 2020, so we could continue to serve young people and make a difference in the community this summer.

We served more than 1200 campers through eight weeks of regular summer camp programs, including a week dedicated to campers from Military families. 179 campers received scholarships or financial assistance, and 350 chose our subsidized Rate B or Rate C pricing. Summer camp 2021 involved more than 20,000 meals, 68,000 camp songs, 1,200 swim tests, 130 Hootenanny skits, and countless friendships.

We are also thankful to our camp families who shared their kids with us this summer, and our summer staff who worked hard to ensure that campers had a fun, safe, and memorable week of camp.
