Change is never easy. For all of us connected with camp, there are so many places, programs and buildings that have very special memories for us. Over the last few years, we have carefully taken the time to meet with campers, camp families and alumni to explore the key elements of what make our camp cabins "camp" cabins. Woven into these little wooden huts with tin roofs are so many touches, smells, sounds and relationships that lend to the life long friendships and memories created inside. After over 70 years of service, these camp homes are reflecting the well loved and well worn years of use. While the programs, lodge, dining hall, shower house, infirmary and offices have all received a total makeover, we have hugged and hung on as best and as long as we could to these time worn treasures. Now, we have reached a bittersweet but exciting chapter in camp's history in which we know it is time for us to gently place the original cabins into retirement. For historical purposes, we will be reserving the original Kleymeyer Cabin (Sioux cabin, Cabin 1, it's had a few names and is the only one with a chimney) and will look into alumni suggestions that we auction the others!



We are pleased to announce that with the support of our camp families, alumni and former camp directors, our Camp Board of Managers and YMCA Board have given approval for us to launch a cabin replacement program. Funding for Phase 1 is complete and pending final construction approval from the state, the first four cabins will undergo construction through this spring and summer. They will still be made of wood with the rustic feel and still have tin roofs, but we've added a lot more living space inside (and a restroom) along with big 6 foot wrap around porches, cuppla and whole house fan. We're also branching out by creating a new village in a new location at camp for these first four cabins. Please be watching the mail and Facebook for further updates as we post photos of the new site, ground breaking and construction as well as information in preparation of Phase 2. We invite you to visit camp this summer for a tour as Phase 1 is completed! We look forward to celebrating this exciting project with you as we strive to continue a legacy that has been a special part of so many lives.

At Camp Carson, Diabetes INdependence Camp will look and feel like our traditional Shoshone camp with the added benefit of campers learning more about living successfully with Type 1 Diabetes. While having a fun week of camp that focuses on camp (not diabetes), campers will have the advantage of living with other campers who deal with diabetes as the norm, so everyone understands the concerns about nutrition, exercise and blood sugar. In the midst of all the fun and at an age appropriate level, campers will also learn more about counting

carbs, checking blood sugar and how to balance food, insulin and exercise. Supporting the traditional camp staff, we will also have a physician, nurses, and nutritionists who will provide additional education and care for this session. Dr. Rebecca Winsett has over 20 years experience with diabetes



camp and will head up our medical staff and supervise the medical care of the campers.

NYPUM NEWS

The dirt bike program continues to be an active part of our camp activity year round. Thanks to our trailer, we are able to take the bikes to Evansville so kids can still begin the 21 riding lessons after school during the school year and then come to camp to ride on the weekends. The NYPUM program is sponsored by Honda who provides the dirt bikes and structure for the outreach. The dirt bikes are put into a replacement rotation so that new bikes are brought in to the program every few years. The used bikes are then taken to a local participating Honda bike shop where they are made ready for resale.

We are blessed to have a great partnership in Evansville with **Westside Honda** who receive the bikes from Honda and put them together for us. This year we were able to involve some of our NYPUM program participants in this process. Part of the NYPUM curriculum involves bike maintenance and it was very exciting for these kids to take part in putting the bikes together under the supervision of the Westside Honda staff.
